Biography

Tricia Wilson has had a passion for singing since the age of 12, and began her professional singing career at the tender age of fifteen. In 1983 Tricia won the SA Great Country Music Awards, and as a result went to Tamworth to represent South Australia in the National Country Music Titles, where she achieved a creditable ‘runner up’ in the

Best Female Vocalist section. On return Trish was taught by John Crossing (NWS 9 Musical Director / Company Blue Band) a long partnership formed that lasted, until, sadly John passed away. Trish went on to tour with Wayne Horsborough and Denise Morrison extensively and this led to supporting acts as the Beggs Brothers, Ted Eagan, Jimmy Little, Felicity, Reg Lindsay and Barry Thorton.

Trish has built up a considerable following, earning a reputation as the “Little Lady with the Big Voice” and once you hear her sing you will be left in no doubt as to why.

Trish has had some memorable moments since performing and her most achievable being recognized by her peers and inducted into the SA Country music Hall of fame in 2006.

Tricia Wilson & Midnight Mountain Blue have been together for 22 years, and won the SA Great Country Music Awards Best Band in 1987. The band has performed at many festivals through-out Australia, and had the honour as the support act with Lee Kernaghan on The Pass the Hat around Tour, with their most recent as supporting Adam Brand at the Truck and Ute Festival at Wallaroo 2006. Tricia Wilson & Midnight Mountain Blue would be one of the longest serving bands in SA Country music spanning 22 years with 4 of the 6 original members.

The Annual General Meeting

The AGM will precede the normal club day at 11.00 am on Sunday 5th August 2007.

Members are advised that motions for discussion on the agenda at the AGM, should have been lodged with the secretary not later than 21 days prior to the AGM. Please note that no motions can be taken from the floor.

The elections will be held to fill the following positions :- **President, Vice President and Publicity Officer** and **six** general committee positions. (no elections will be necessary if there is only one nomination for each position)

The Club Awards:-

The recipient of the Industry Award is chosen by the committee, from nominations submitted by the members by July 22nd. The recipient of the Merit Award is chosen by the members at the AGM, from nominations submitted earlier by the members. Past recipients of the awards are not eligible to be nominated for the same award again.

Mildura Country Music Festival

Organisers have just completed compiling nominations for the 2007 Southern Stars – the Australian Independent Country Music Awards.

The Awards are held in conjunction with the giant 10 day Mildura Country Music Festival, and Awards organiser John Arnold said that a total of 238 individual nominations have been received for the eight judged categories, representing recorded product from 93 individual artists and groups.

The highest nominations were received in APRA/AMCOS Australian Independent Single of the Year with 70 entries and One Stop Entertainment Australian Independent Album of the Year with 50. Australian Heritage Track of the Year received 34 nominations, followed by Male and Female Vocalist with 26 and 20 respectively.

The Australian Independent Country Music Awards are now in their 11th year, and are widely recognised as a major benchmark for Independent Country Music Artists., 2007 Southern Stars finalists will be announced on Friday, August 10, with winners to be announced at a Gala Concert at the Mildura Arts Centre Theatre on Saturday, 6 October.

The program for the 2007 Mildura Country Music Festival is now available online. There will be over 100 artists performing at the 21st Birthday of the Festival. The exciting news is that as well as many regular performers at this year's Festival, there will be 20 artists who were not at the 2006 Festival. They include Donna Boyd, John O'Dea, Craig Stewart, Kelly Hope, Greg Bain, Matt Manning, Susan Lily and Jason Ryan.

Included in the program this year will be some dedicated days at Country on the Darling and Henderson Park to the Bush Balladeers. Popular Balladeer Jeff Brown will be bringing his band to Mildura for the first time. They will join the very talented Sally-Anne Whitten and her

band Rumour Mill from Tamworth, who will also be very popular at the Mildura Festival.

The Walk Ups that have been held at Hudaks Bakery have moved to new venues. A popular venue of the Festival, The Mildura Gateway Tavern will host the morning shows with Ian Muir from 8am until 10am, while a new venue EnjoyLife Cafe at Centro Mildura for the night Walk Up, will be again be hosted by Graeme McCardle, from 6pm until 8pm.

This is the earliest that the Mildura program has been launched and will assist fans in making preparation for their visit to the Festival. Free entry to all events (except the Awards and the Talent Quest) will continue to be a feature of the Festival.

Fred Champion's Induction into the National Road Transport Hall of Fame

In August our Fred Champion will be inducted into the National Road Transport Hall of Fame in Alice Springs. "The Australian Road Transport Hall of Fame not only remembers the great trucks buses and vehicles of the past, but also the contribution of the men and women who dedicated their lives to these great machines."

Joy was asked to write a few words about her Fred.

"Fred started driving at the age of 9-10 when he used to drive a tray truck to Melbourne markets from Lake Boga Victoria with a pillow behind him. His father drove another vehicle in one in front of Fred. Fred's truck was left in the outer suburbs and Fred's dad would take him with him to unload his father's truck at the Markets then come back and get Fred's truck and do the same.

Fred brought his first semi, a Seddon, from Melbourne to Adelaide at the age of 14 years 3 months and owned his own truck at 16. He used to the cart cars (1949 Hillman

Minx) to Brisbane. Because he was under age, to own a truck he trusted someone to make the payments for him. The payments were not passed on so Fred lost the truck. He was devastated so started working for a boss.

Fred still does an odd day helping out mates if they are in trouble.

He has also worked on oil rig moves taking him away for months at a time. He has also moved other heavy equipment."

29th Country SA Music Festival & Awards (Barmera)

The Festival was a great success. I missed the first few days of the festival, so missed out on seeing some of the artists like Bill Chambers and Genevieve Spalding.

The major attractions were all very good. Roydon Donahue had a wonderfully smooth voice, singing Elvis tunes etc., Tom Maxell, Billy Bridge and Rebecca Lee Nye, Laura Downing, The Davidson Brothers, Kristy Cox (really one of ours!), Kelly Hope and Doug Bruce all sounded great. South Australian local artists (and Poets) including especially Sarge and Darin Warner, Danny Hooper, Alison Hams, Mark Tempany, Dave Prior, Bob Magor (poet but also on drums!) and Charlie McCracken were as good as any of the interstate artists!

One of my favourite shows was "Murray Mac's Impersonations Show" featuring Patsy Cline, Willie Nelson, Dolly Parton, Johnny Cash, Jim Reeves, Burl Ives, Kitty Wells, Slim Whitman Marty Robbins Slim Dusty etc. It was reported that the Cobdogla District Club had one of its largest attendances on record that night. The Saturday Awards night also provided great entertainment featuring most of the above interstate and local artists. Danielle Mowbray from Mt Gambier did especially well taking out the female vocal award. She was also awarded the SA Award of Excellence the next day. Darin Warner won Male Vocal on the Saturday evening and was runner up for the Frank Harding SA Award of Excellence on Sunday.
