August Show:- Carole Sturtzel and Wild Oats

This band has been a familiar name in South Australia for quite some years now and refuses to lie down and die. Carole and the boys still love belting it out for their remaining followers, ageing together disgracefully (ha ha). Appearing every now and then at one of the Country music clubs or RSL shows, Carole says they enjoy the fact that the audience still give them the thumbs up after all these years.

The line-up has varied over the years but Carole and Ian Scott never budge. They are there for the duration they say. Carole's success has been well covered in various publications but Ian Scott's story is just as impressive. Scotty, as he is affectionately known, has worked with the best, touring around the country with many of the top artists in the sixties and seventies, including the talented and humorous Scott Brothers of television fame. Ian joined Carole and Wild Oats in the eighties and their successful union began. Scotty also works solo as a singer/guitarist with full production backing all created by himself. This he does in between working with Carole. They are selective these days and you don't see them as frequently as in the past, leaving Carole and Scotty to pursue the other musical interests in their lives.

Scotty has always dabbled in craft work. Leather work is his speciality, along with wood carving and stage props etc. Carole is involved with, the Music History Hunters of South Australia, along with other musicians keen on collecting and collating as much material as they can gather with a view to creating a comprehensive record of entertainment in this state. This collection will be housed at the State

Library and requires much preparation by the members of the committee. They run huge music celebrations at the Arkaba Hotel in Glen Osmond every 3 or 4 months. It is becoming quite the place to go. Dave Brogden has been their main drummer for a good 10 years and is sought after by others bands (appearing regularly with big Jim Hermel) and it's no wonder with his incredible style. Wayne Cheary on bass is the new boy on the block, coming from Billy Tea and other country, bush and rock bands and brings a new sound to Wild Oats (bass player Billy Pfeiffer retired from the band a couple of years ago).

Carole's successful daughter, Beccy Cole, loves getting her mum up to sing with her when she does a show in South Australia or when Carole goes with her to the Tamworth Country Music Festival each January. These days Carole's main interest is watching Beccy's career soar and proud mum loves it if Beccy turns up at one of the Wild Oats gigs to join Carole in a couple of numbers as they did when Beccy's career began right there with Wild Oats (for about five or six years).

Carole has a return to Channel 7's Country Style with a season coming up in August, called the Johnny Mac show with Carole Sturtzel, including various country artists from the successful show. The places and dates will appear in the gig guide so don't miss out on a chance to relive those old days - there are 5 shows in 5 different suburbs from North to South.

The Adelaide Country Music Club will be firing on the 3rd August so be there and catch Carole and the Oats and be prepared for a great day.

September show - Allan Webster

South Australian Contemporary Country Singer/
Songwriter.

Allan Webster, the 1999 South Australian Champion of Champions of Country Music will make one of his rare appearances in his home state of South Australia when he performs at the Adelaide Country Music club on Sunday 7th. He will be supported by Henry Czerwonka on lead guitar, Bert Diegmann on drums and Mark Moffatt on bass guitar.

Allan has been involved in the music industry for more years than he cares to remember but the last few years have however been dedicated to country music, and swapping the old “Mersey sound” for a country twang has been a wise career move for Allan and he has become a successful solo artist giving him the opportunity to travel both interstate and overseas.

After performing at the Bay of Islands Country Rock Festival in New Zealand Allan was invited as the only Australian artist to perform at the Marton festival in January 2006. This in turn led to being invited to the New Plymouth Festival of Lights and also the Marton festival again in 2007 & 2008. While in New Zealand Allan performed at the Hawrea, Taranaki and Merrilands and Pirongia Country Music clubs, the Ngaruawahia Bowl club and the Te Awanutu RSA.

A report in the *Australasian Country Music News* praised Allan for his performance at the Festival of Lights where he took to the stage for 90 minutes.

“He rocked through his songs, including “The Joker’s Wild” – the self penned song from his first album, with energy and enthusiasm. He also did justice to quieter songs, including one of his own sentimental compositions called, “The Locket”, from his “Guitar Man” album. The audience was impressed with this Mersey – born “Aussie”. Allan has a dynamic stage presence and is able to keep his audiences’ attention”

September Guest Lee Brocky with Ben Furnell

Lee Brocky has been very successful in the country music festival circuit for a number of years. Lee is well known for the energy he shows when performing and the way he can captivate an audience.

His career highlights so far include the Male winner for 2002 for the Victorian Champion of Champions, and finalist in 4 competitions in Tamworth in 2004, which included the Aristocrat Entertainer of the Year and the CCMA Talent Quest.

Later in 2004 he performed in the South Australian Council for Country Music Showcase. In March 2004 Lee was a support act to Troy Cassar-Daley at the ‘Beachport Festival by the Sea’.

Lee took some time out late 2005 to record his debut album ‘Memory Lane’, which demonstrates his songwriting ability and his fine musicianship.

After his tour of New Zealand in January 2008, and his performances at the Marton Festival, Allan was nominated by Mr Bob Everhart, President of the National Traditional Country Music Association, to be inducted into “America’s Old Time Country Music Hall of Fame” in Iowa, U.S.A. to be staged at the 33rd Annual National Old Time Country & Bluegrass Festival August 25th – 31st 2008.

Mr. Everhart said, *“Allan attained a high status as a performer of classic country and bluegrass music and he was more than impressed with his deliverance of Hank Williams songs”*

Unfortunately Allan will be unable to attend this year but plans to travel over next year.

A third album is in the planning stages and hopefully will be ready by September.

Allan features in festivals in New Zealand, South Australia, Victoria, New South Wales, and especially Tasmania where he tours extensively for 5/6 weeks twice a year. He is a very professional performer who loves to entertain, which is reflected in his performances, and he is available for festivals and country music events. Our Len Wakefield awardee, Georgette Berry, won the 2008 Frank Harding SA Award of Excellence. She also came first in the Senior Gospel section. Other winners included Nathaniel O'Brien in the Gospel Junior 13 and under and in the 16 years and under section, Danny Gyory won the Instrumental Section, Kristal Collins won the Songwriting Section, Terry Bradford and Helen Ellis won the Duo Section and also combined with Dixie Dale (The Texettes) to win the Band Section. The Female Vocal Section was won by Kristal Collins and the Male Vocal by John Turner. The Texettes also won the Country Rock Section. The 'Star Step' contest was again held on the final day. The Star Step Talent Quest is for SA Award Contestants who did not receive a 1st Prize Trophy in SA Awards Sections on Friday or Saturday competitions. (Our Kevin Merritt came in second in the male vocalist section).

The Hall of fame inductees this year were Troy Cassar-Daley, Michel Rose and Chris 'Trucking' Stevens. Full results are on the official www.riverlandcountrymusic.com site, and more results and pictures of course on www.sacm.com.

The main attractions this year were Troy Cassar-Daley and his band plus the Feral Swing Katz Stuie French, Camille Te Nahu and Michel Rose (plus a bass player). The Katz put on a great show on Saturday night in the Barmera Theatre and again at the field day site on Sunday.

As usual there was great entertainment at the Football Club, Cobby Club, Barmera Hotel and various other venues in the

SACCM 2008 Champion of Champions

As reported on page two for our president's report 'Champs' was held recently. The event was held at our club's regular meeting place, the Slovenian Club on Saturday July 19. The number of contestants and audience was not as high as previous years, but a good time was had by all who attended. I would not have liked to be a judge as it would not have been easy to determine the ranking of such wonderful talent.

Different judges were used for the final assessment in the evening. The day time judges, Barry O'Brien (of 5PBA), Charlie McCracken and Dot McDonnell chose the three finalists in each section and the evening judges the heat winners plus the Junior and Senior Champion of Champions. The evening judges were Fil Galantomos, Bec Bates (from Arts SA) and Dirk Zadra. Fil and Dirk are on the SACCM Board of Governors. Arts SA are a major sponsor. Most of the evening judges had not seen the competitors before so were able to make decisions unbiased by any the competitor's previous performances. Again it would not have been an easy job. Most agreed

they made the right choices (as did the daytime judges!).

The 2008 Senior Champion of Champions was Kristal Collins from Mount Compass, the Junior Champion of Champions was Mahalia Fox from Mount Gambier. Heat winners were Gabrielle Ballard (from Port Augusta) - Under 13, Kristal Collins – Senior Female, Danny Gyory – Senior Male.

The Champs Band was composed of Simon Ranger, Anthony Stewart, Paul Orchard and Alison Hams. They did a wonderful job backing the contestants. Alison also entertained all with a number of her songs and also joined in with Mark Tempany in the evening part. Tiffney Stroh, the 2007 Senior Champion of Champion also appeared in the evening session.

The final result, *'Reckless Side Of Me'* showcases her powerful and emotional vocals. The newest resident of the NSW Central Coast penned half of the tracks on the album that talks of love both good & bad (I Can Say That Now &

Nothing To Me), relationships (Ain't No Man), some party tracks for the girls (Girls Get Loud & Talk Dirty To Me) plus a comedic take on how women are *supposed* to act (Ladylike). The first single & title track, *Reckless Side Of Me* examines the internal battle between right and wrong.

'Reckless Side Of Me', the debut album from 2008 Toyota Star Maker winner Talia Wittmann, will be released on August 2nd 2008 on Compass Bros Records through Destra Music and will be officially launched at this year's Toyota National Country Music Muster on Wednesday August 27th.
