Well there is plenty to tell you since our last show, which went really well with Tracey Rains and Claypan.

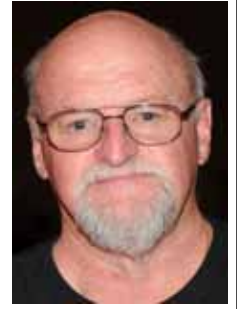

December show guest artist:- Jim Hermel

Jim has appeared at the Club many times through the years.

Like the Coads Jim Hermel has been inducted into the Tamworth, "Hands Of Fame" (in 2009).

From his website:- "Like most genuinely talented recording artists, Jim Hermel's rise to success was no overnight occurrence. Considered one of the finest guitarists around, he was soon backing lead guitarist to Australia's top recording stars, John Farnham, Billy Thorpe, Ronnie Burns, Denise Drysdale, on concert tours early in their careers and later graduated to a session musician on records and television commercials. In the late 1970's and early 1980's, Jim emerged as a recording

and concert star in his own right, as vocalist, multi-instrumentalist, and songwriter. Three albums recorded at that time were all widely acclaimed, receiving national and international air-play."

In 2004 Jim married Virginia Coad, whom he'd met when they were both working at the Royal Melbourne Show in 1988. Jim and Virginia were married on the Quorn Railway Station in March of 2004, and honeymooned in the United States in May, 2004. On that tour, Jim and Virginia performed concerts in Arizona and Tennessee.

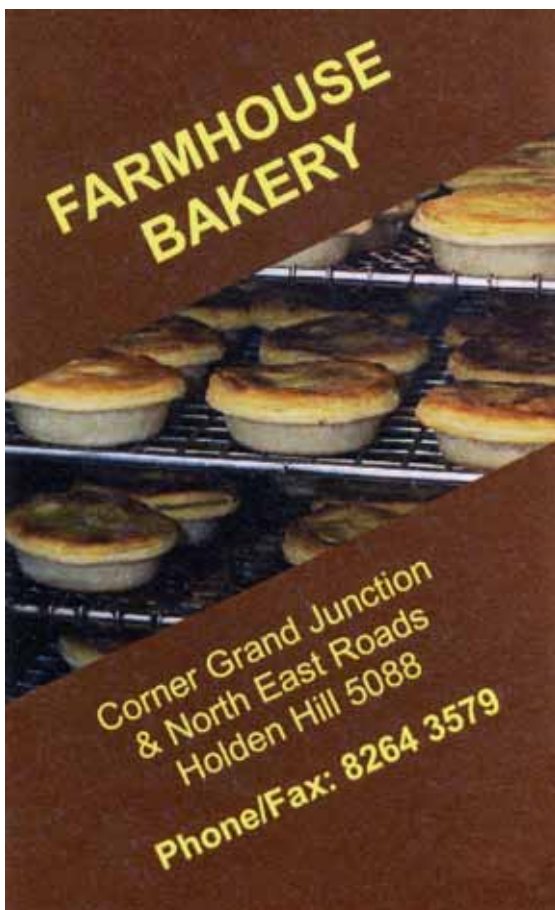

Len Wakefield Memorial Fund

Subject to certain conditions, the purpose of the fund is to assist younger talent with proven ability: a) in entering talent quests throughout Sth Aust, Mildura and Tamworth, b) by payment or part payment of professional tuition, and c) towards the cost of a musical instrument. The fund is administered by the ACMC committee with

expenditure limited to the interest from capital invested, with all payments made to the appropriate body and NOT to the awardee. Annually an awardee is chosen at an event deemed suitable by the Full Committee by a judging panel consisting of three suitably qualified ACMC committee members. Contributions to the fund, which may be made to the club treasurer at any time will be acknowledged in the club newsletter. Page 6

His strong vocal sound has won countless Awards and Murray has gone on to earn the affections of Fans across the country. In 2001 Murray became Vice President of the South Australian Country Music Festival and went on to become President in 2005. He regularly shares centre stage with Australia's best and with his band 'True Grit' was support act for Adam Harvey and Lee Kernighan at the Outback Cattle Drive Concerts. Murray gives powerful performances to a multitude of songs from Ballads to Country Rock and has

a massive repertoire. He was the proud recipient of the SA Industry Award for Service and Dedication to Country Music and has recorded two albums 'Now & Then' and 'Little Bit of Love Little Bit of Honky Tonk'. Murray is also well known for his hard work and encouragement of new and young talent in the industry and presents the SA 'Tamworth' Showcase each year. Murray was inducted into the SA Country Music Hall of Fame in 2001."

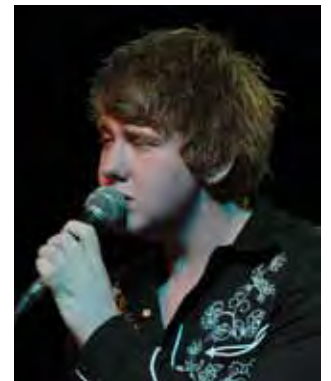

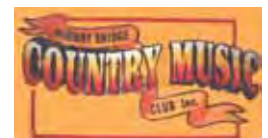
