* aged 74. *
* Born at Iron Knob, Colin spent many *
* years in the outback as a Boundary *
* Rider at Beltana Station in SA's *
* far north. *
* He also maintained the dogproof *
* fence and worked as a fetter on the *
* Ghan railway line. *
* His square dancing interest began *
* in the 50's when he established his *
* own club at Thebarton Town Hall. *
* Colin called square dancing for *
* nearly nine years, on Reg Lindsay's *
* C&W hour where he made an estimated *
* 500 appearances. *
* He was honoured in 1983 when his *
* handprints were added to the hands *
* of fame at Tamworth NSW, and again *
* in 1984, when he was inducted into *
* the Avenue of Fame at Rocky. Page's *
* Riverland CM complex. *

PEOPLE IN PROFILE

Glen was born at Cockatoo Valley in SA's Barossa Valley, and it was during his latter school days as a boy soprano, he took up singing.

Becoming interested in music at an early age he had learned to play Banjo, Mandolin, Auto Organ, Flute and Guitar by the age of 14, and went on to teach guitar at many music colleges around Adelaide.

He sang regularly on radio programs in the 1950's and on Johnny Mac's C&W hour on early Adelaide TV.

It was about this time Glen did some (78 acetate) recordings, at SAD.

The mid 1950's saw Glen form his first band "The Cactus Kids" appearing at many local functions including regular appearances at Marrabel Rodeo.

His first paid performance of 5 shillings (50c), was at the local Picture Theatre where it was popular, in those days, to show Cowboy movies on Saturday afternoons and it was during interval Glen sang on stage.

In recent years, Pedal Steel Guitar drew his attention and his talents are now focussed in this direction.

He is the Correspondent in S.A., for Capital News, a Country Music newspaper out of Tamworth NSW.

Presenting Country Music on radio 5UV, and now 5EBI, and 5CKY, Glen is now concentrating on helping others in CM.

PEOPLE IN PROFILE

Born in Bulli, New South Wales, in 1948, Mike spent the first 16 years of his life moving from one mining town to another with his metallurgist father.

Later as a wool-classer he spent many years traveling to shearing runs in South Australia, Queensland and West Australia.

During this time he formed a strong affiliation with the bush and it's people, and became well known in the sheds for impromptu concerts around the campfires and in the local pubs on Saturday nights.

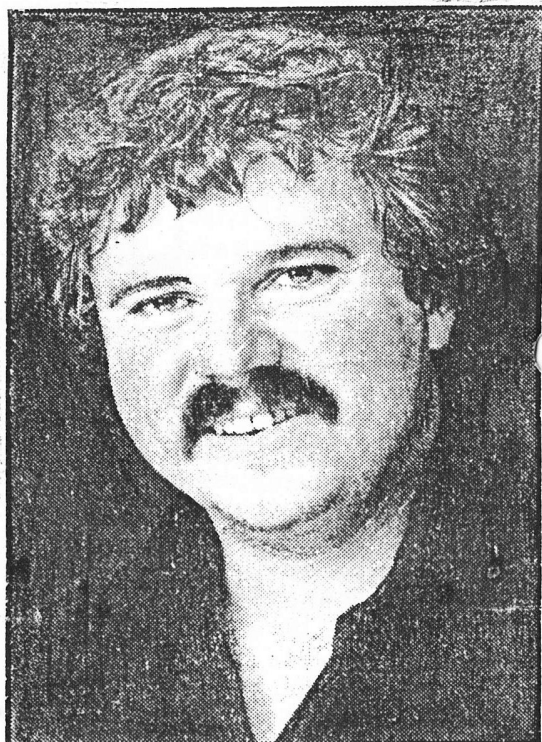
Mike has been playing musical instruments since he was five, and by the time he was twelve years old he could play ukulele, banjo and guitar.

From a very early age he could sing and spent many of his early years, specialising in soprano harmonies and solos.

He returned to the city in 1972, and began performing around Adelaide, as well as writing and performing many TV and radio jingles.

He has been involved with several bands and was lead singer with local Country bands "Stardust" and "Little Rock".

Mike is now working as a solo artist and is concentrating on song writing, with the intention of putting together an album of original songs in the near future.
