The committee is giving serious consideration to an out-door festival, possibly after the Tamworth Awards next year.

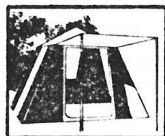
Members are asked to give any assistance they can for this event please don't hesitate to offer your help or ideas.

Having to leave commercial radio due to his ever failing eyesight, Rob returned to Adelaide and secured a position with the Defence Research Centre, Salisbury and also became involved with public radio, where he has presented programs on SKY, SUV and has a current program (Bluegrass Express) on 5MMM, Sundays at 11:00am.

With several other country music enthusiasts, Rob helped to form the ACMC early this year.

He has always had an avid interest in Country Music and can remember listening to the radio, "Hillbilly Billy music back in those days" at very odd hours sometimes very early in the morning (much to the real discomfort of his room mates).

He regularly listened to Bob Fricker (5AD), Mel Cameron (5DN), Jim Chamings (5KA) and "Songs of The Prairie" on 2WG which was heard on Saturday nights prior to 2TM's arrival on the scene.

He has an extensive record collection of country albums, 45's and many old 78's and while his two favourite artists in America and Australia are Hank Williams Snr. and buddy williams, the Stanley Brothers/Reno & Smiley head the Bluegrass field.

His sporting interests include country Football and Cricket, where he holds dual life membership in the respective Tasman clubs, Port Lincoln.

Lloyd is also a Keen Steam-train supporter, belonging to the "Pichi Richi (Quorn) Railway and the Ghan (Alice Springs) preservation societies.

He has a daughter Shana and two grandchildren Carola & Troy.

Pete says: "The trip was worth it as the price was right and the quality of the 93 original tracks was good".

"In my opinion Tex would wear the World Crown for the best 'trick' yodeller in the world, doing those twiddly notes in the back of his throat, which a lot of his imitators couldn't manage, including myself".

"A lady who was kind enough to give me her name as Mrs Jeanette Hawk, told me she had been hypnotised by Tex when he was in Mildura with Ashtons Circus, in the early 60's (she was 16 at the time and formerly Miss Armstrong) I told her I remembered Mike Walsh, of the former TV midday show, asking Tex whether it was all fair dinkum, and whether he would now care to 'come clean' about it. Tex replied there was nothing phony about his ability in hypnosis".

"I know it is on record Tex gained a BA, PhD degree from a Canadian University and ventured into the field of Hypnotherapy while in Canada, I believe it was the University of Montreal, certainly though our Australian pioneer of country Music was an amazing man with a great personality and many talents".
