

RECORD REVIEW

NEW ALBUM by Randy Travis "No Holdin' Back" is the fourth from this USA artist.

A big improvement on his last release "Old 8*10", the album includes perennial songs Singing The Blues and It's Just a Matter of Time.

DON WILLIAMS first recording with a new label (RCA). A little disappointing, this album "One Good Well" is not the best he has produced and wont take out the Best ever Don Williams award.

USA FEMALE Vocalist of The Year Kathy Mattea, has a new album "Willow In The Wind" whether it is as good as her last is open to conjecture.

It's doubtful if there is another 18 Wheels here.

AUSTRALIAN songwriter of the year, Gold Guitar winner (We've Done Us Proud) and the North album singer, Graeme Connors has a new release "South of These Days".

With excellent music production and good lyrics the album is sure to please.

With North and South albums behind him, will the next one be East or West?

SELECTION records (Eric Watson) goes into the 1990's with production of compact discs only.

Evelyn Bury leads the field with "Someday An Eagle" 12 tracks chosen from the cream of Aussie songwriters.

Recorded at Ross McGregor's Axent studios in Sydney using top class session musicians and a general mix of acoustic it has good credit details and informative cover notes.

SINGLES worth a mention are:- "Shoalhaven Man" featuring THE BUSHWACKERS - "You Taught Me All I Know" probably the best we have heard from JEANETTE JAMES so far - "No More Do The Shears Go Click Click Click" KEN PARMENTER has put new words to a classic with good results - "Home and Away Game" A good song from KEITH GLASS - "I'll Still Love You In The Morning" - A tired set of lyrics but well presented by STEVEN BUNZ
