

A very special thank you to our guests Patsy Biscoe and the Countyy Zoo (Damian & Wayne Anthony), Their performance gave our day that special meaning.


Thank you to everyone who made the day, especially the audience.

STUNNING PERFORMANCE:

Country music fans who saw the 46 year old Tammy Wynette in concert, at the apollo Stadium, Adelaide 6/3/90, witnessed a stunning performance.

Superbly gowned, she strode out trim, taut and terrific, image-wise and song-wise, amid wild applause and wolf whistles throughout - A truly professional artist of both schools, traditional and modern.

After a bright start to the show by ventriloquist, Chris Kirby, Tammy was on stage for one and a half hours with her troupe, giving us rare treats, beginning with medleys of her songs from the 60's, 70's and 80's.

Quipping and cajoling with her clever accompanists and the audience, she continued with more of her songs in detail, songs like Stand By Your Man, I Don't Wanna Play House, D.I.V.O.R.C.E. and so on.

Of particular interest to me, were gospel songs of the "deep south", in the Carter Family tradition including the classic Precious Memories which she sang with two of her lady harmonists - All girls from the south she said - Men AND woman darted foreward with clicking cameras.

Tammy said she thought the response from her Australian audiences was marvelous and she would be returning.

As a complement to fans, after the show, she obligingly autographed dozens, perhaps hundreds, of cassettes and brochures.

We thought it beokened a sweet heart from an artist of her calibre.
