## COUNTRY MUSIC

### WHAT FUTURE IN SOUTH AUSTRALIA

Country music in South Australia is at this time seeing a revival which it has not experienced since the 1950-60's when various radio shows were on air which included such personalities as Bob Fricker, and another show called Under the Stars. Country music was then part of the normal programming of radio and various songs were on the hit parade of the day. Later when TV arrived some country music shows appeared and we had shows by Maurie Lawson on the ABC, The Roger Cardwell's, Country and Western Show on Channel 9, this show was very popular during the 1960's, it included many artists that were founders of country music as it is today. The show was eventually presented by Reg Lindsay, which also enjoyed great popularity.

Road shows were a popular source of country music throughout the 1950-60's, these shows mainly concentrated on the country towns, and shows. Adelaide was often bypassed with only the occasional show venturing into the city and even now country areas generally fare better, things are gradually changing and appearances by visiting artists should become a more regular feature of the Adelaide country music scene.

Since the late 1960's no other TV show has been seen, but various radio programmes have been and gone. One show that has stood the test of time is the show on 5RM, presented by Rocky Page, this show has been on for many years and is one of the most listened to CM shows on S.A. radio. The ABC with Jan Springett made a valiant attempt on Tuesday evenings but only lasted for a few months, 5KA had a period when they tried an all country format but again was only on for a short period.

Public Radio has taken up the challenge of presenting country music to the fans of South Australia, currently there are three (3) programmes, with a possibility of one other. 5UV, University Radio, presents a show on Sunday afternoons from 4-6.00pm, hosted by various members of the A.C.M.C.

One of the longest running programmes of country music can be heard on Saturday nights from 10.00pm to 1.00am on public radio 5PBA, Northern Stereo, which is hosted by various presenters, and co-ordinated by Henk Jensen. This is a show well worth listening to.

5MMM also has a country music programme on Sundays from 5-6.00pm which has been on air for approx ten (10) years and is presented by Steve Davis and Les Cross. Sky Radio also may be on air again soon with a CM show, which could be hosted by Chris Hill, Good Luck Sky. 5CS (1000AM), Pt Lincoln has a show on Sundays from 9.30 to 11.30pm hosted by Ken Prior. So at the moment fans have a reasonable selection of programmes on SA radio from which to choose from. Unfortunately no TV channel has a regular show, other than the occasional special, we can only hope that things may change in the future.

Country music in South Australia over the past 3-4 years has seen an increase in it's popularity, due mainly to influence of the festivals at Barmera and Pt Pirie, even though both of these shows have been around for a number of years, they have gained prominence in attendance and the attraction of interstate artists especially in the last few years which is great for CM in Sth. Aust.

We have also seen the emergence of several new or the re-establishment of clubs and organisations in the both the city and country areas of the state. These include clubs at Murray Bridge, Mt. Gambier, Barossa Valley, Southern C.M. Club's, and our own club The Adelaide Country Music Club. All clubs are enjoying a period of popularity and are encouraging a greater involvement by fans and artists in the promotion of country music in Sth. Aust.

So what is the future of country music in South Australia? This really is a question that only the CM fans and the committees of the various organisation can determine. As clubs and organisation we must show a greater unity in our aims and objectives and in some cases look to the future and not so much dwell on the events of the past.

For country music to achieve a greater acceptance by the general public we may have to broaden our concept of country music to not only the traditional styles but also accept some of the modern sounds that the Young Performers are producing today. This is not to say we disregard where the roots of country music came from but to accept the fact that all things change and if Australian country music is to advance and remain a strong influence in the musical and cultural future of the South Australian lifestyle, we must look to the Youth of South Australia.

This is by no means a comprehensive report on all aspects of Country Music in Sth. Aust. and many people who have contributed to country music over the past 4-5 decades have not been mentioned for this I apologize.

The opinions expressed about the future of country are not necessarily the only views but they are points that must be considered.

In future editions of the newsletter we will take a closer look at various events and personalities that have been a part of CM in Sth Aust. So if any person has any information on personalities or events that have influenced CM in Sth. Aust or even a good natured story please contact me at the club or Ph. 2632912.

ROB'S RECORD REVIEW.

Well folk's after not having submitted a review for last month I'm back and raring to go. So here goes !!

The release by Anne Kirkpatrick "OUT OF THE BLUE" on the ABC label is an absolute GEM with a much broader selection of tracks, with both Aust. and U.S.A. writers, a top band behind Anne makes this the best release (ED. Did'nt we have a best a couple of month ago). Anne will be in Barmera, June long weekend.

Other local releases include Carlene Carter's "I Fell in Love", Yes ! Johnny's stepdaughter but she is different to Rosanne but classy with good muso support and strong songs.- Have listen.

Although we have not got copies of Rex Dallas' "Coal Mining Songs" and Brian Letton's newy, also Dee Morison's "On The Road" they have been reported to be released.

Jerry Jeff Walker's "Navajo Rug", T.G.Sheppard's Greatest Hits" are now avavailable locally.

There has also been a CD 20 track, Lefty Fizzell, Guitar Greats or Legends of Country Guitar. Ernest Tubb "Live in '65" which is the only Tubb release actually recorded live, the CD has extra tracks including the Driftwood on a River track.

The Rhino Billboard 1958-68 Top Ten tracks from each year will satisfy those whose LP's are a bit scratchy now, CD's with all your favourites and at a local price.

Also Garth Brooks has two CD's scheduled for release and these are great - I've had them on import for some months and like them both the more I hear each.

An interesting statistic on country sales Australia wide is that 81% of all sales, are of U.S. artists, so I say support the artists YOU prefer if you want them to record or continue to do so.

If you have any trouble obtaining these releases or others contact me as I will only to pleased to help wherever I can.

PS. The Allan Jackson ARISTA CD "Here in the Real World" now locally available will become the headliner for an imminent BMG/MCA release of many new U.S. acts with TV marketing and SUV Country Participation (An Sth. Aust Exclusive), so stay tuned to 531AM. we make thinks happen.
